The Gospel of Luke recalls how Jesus had power over life and death. Jesus came upon a funeral procession. He probably encountered many of them in his 33 years of life, but this was a unique situation. The man who had died was "the only son of his mother, and she was also a widow." She was destitute because women in that day were totally dependent upon men, their husbands and of course their sons at times. Her son was probably helping his mother out before he died. Over and over again we hear in the Bible how "God is close to the broken hearted" and "God defends the rights of the poor." Since Jesus is fully God and fully human, he witnesses in his person God's love and care for these two groups, the broken hearted and the poor destitute people of this world. Jesus raised her son back to life because "he was moved with pity for her." In the first reading Elijah, the great prophet with whom Jesus consulted up on the mount of Transfiguration about his passage through death that was about to occur in Jerusalem, also prayed for the son of a widow after the son had died. "The Lord heard the prayer of Elijah; the life breath returned to the child's body and he revived." Jesus fell within the prophetic tradition of the Jewish people but the scriptures make it clear that he was more than a prophet. He raised the son of the widow by his own power. Elijah prays to God and God hears his prayer, but in Luke, Jesus, by his own power says, "'Young man, I tell you arise.' The dead man sat up and began to speak and Jesus gave him to his mother." When we care for the destitute like Jesus did we are His Body in this day. His Spirit, his life breath, is alive in us today.
