"The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for the harvest" (Luke 10:2). People in this area know how hectic the harvest is. There is a short number of days, compounded with unfavorable weather sometimes, and each day the amount of daylight lessens. Many hands are needed all at once. It seems like the beet harvest is one of the more hectic experiences of farming possible. Shifts go twenty four hours a day attempting to reap the harvest late in the year before winter sets in. Accidents happen when people are tired and in a hurry. My own brother-in-law died during beet harvest and he left a wife and three children in 2002 because of a head-on beet truck accident. Jesus compares the harvest for the need to announce that "The Kingdom of God is at hand." He considers it a life and death matter. There is an urgency that comes with the harvest and there should be an urgency when it comes to sharing Jesus' message. Sometimes, I think that we have lost the edge because we do not really believe that Hell is a reality, at least for the people we know. It is a real danger when we start to believe that everyone goes to Heaven. Why make a sacrifice when I believe God is so good that he would never condemn anyone to the eternal fires of hell? Jesus sends his disciples out two by two to announce "the kingdom of God is at hand for you." He goes on to tell them, "Whatever town you enter and they do not receive you, go out into the streets and say, 'the dust of your town that clings to our feet, even that, we shake off against you.' Yet know this: the kingdom of God is at hand. I tell you it will be more tolerable for Sodom on that day than for that town." Remember the story of Sodom. How fire rained down from heaven to destroy it. What we hear in the scriptures does not really jive with the way the majority believe these days: that it is optional to go to Mass; that I go when it is convenient. Let us pray for more workers in God's harvest who are really concerned about telling the message of the Kingdom, this life and death, heaven or hell, reality. We also pray for our seminarians including Ethan Kaste from our parish.
