I have been praying a novena for the success of our trip to Haiti. I
think my prayers and your prayers were answered this last
Wednesday. We left ahead of the storm Wednesday and
flew out on Thursday. We were scheduled to leave at 5
am, but did not leave until 7:30. We missed our
connections but I was told we were the only flight that made it out of
Fargo that day because of the blizzard. We were able to rearrange
and after an overnight in Fort Lauderdale. I am sitting this Friday (01-
12-18) at the airport at 4 in the morning to fly out at 6 a.m. to Port-au-
Prince Haiti. Our schedule has not been affected much except we
missed a night in Port au Prince. We are going up to visit a building
of a school today in Deslandes. Our group is actively investigating a
plan for construction of the school. We have raised
around \$320,000 toward our goal of \$351,000 with a promised gift to
come when construction begins. Those traveling to Haiti this time are
the following: Bill Borderland, who is a contractor, Jeff Blanchard,
Sheila Trontvet, Tammy Campbell and myself. Please continue to
pray for our efforts as we try to assist the poorest of the poor. I will
be going to Northern Mexico as a side trip on the 23rd to visit the
farm workers who come up to North Dakota during the summer time.
We are working on a national Encuentro this summer. That too
needs attention. Our Bishop wants the Fargo Diocese to be involved.
I am still the coordinator of Hispanic Ministry in our diocese. I
appreciate all your prayers and I will pray for you.
